- creation of long term, sustainable local jobs
- a tendering approach that will provide opportunities for Outer Hebrides businesses
- investment in commercial infrastructure
- delivery of training and enhancement of skills for current and new island residents

- will deliver betterment of infrastructure utilised in construction
